Important Note

Applicants will be accepted on a first-come-first-served basis and enrolment will close as soon as the course is full. Since this intake is limited to a maximum of 15-20 students, applicants are strongly recommended to apply as early as possible to avoid disappointment.

Tuition/Supervision

Candidates will receive compulsory tuition in Research Methods by way of 4 online lectures (at 2 hours each) and 3 online workshops (at 1 hour each). The medium of instruction is English. Successful applicants will be provided with full details of scheduling, etc. prior to enrolling on the course. Each candidate will also be provided with on-going support from a supervisor from Manchester Metropolitan University and/or a Hong Kong-based supervisor in the candidate's chosen field of research.

Assessment

Candidates will be assessed by way of 2 pieces of written work: each candidate will submit a 3,000-word Research Proposal (constituting 15% of their final mark) and a 15,000-word Final Dissertation (constituting 85% of their final mark). Assessed work must be completed within (normally) 1 year from commencement of the course.

Course Fees

There is no application fee. If accepted onto the course, applicants will need to pay a course fee of HK\$61,500 to HKU SPACE and a separate registration fee of GBP£999 to Manchester Metropolitan University. Course fees paid are non-refundable and non-transferable.

How to Apply

All applicants must provide proof of having graduated from the PCLL or an equivalent professional legal qualification course acceptable to Manchester Metropolitan University, such as the LPC or BPTC.

Online

HKUSPACE provides 24-hour online application for students to apply via the Internet. Please input the Personal Particulars via the online application form and upload the soft copy of required documents in pdf format. You must submit **a copy of HKID or passport**; a clearly readable copy of your **PCLL (or equivalent) Graduation Certificate**; and **also page 2 of the application form (4. Preferred Research Areas and 5. Further Information on your Research Interests)**. If your application is successful, you may be required to show us the originals of the documents (i.e. HKID or passport and academic qualification) you submitted before your place is confirmed.

In person or by post

Applications can be conveniently made through the enrolment counters of HKU SPACE Learning Centres, where our staff can verify and stamp photocopies of applicants' documents provided that applicants **bring both the original documents and photocopies thereof with them**. Or you can obtain certified true copies in English of these and submit these together with your application. Applications may also be submitted by post to the College of Humanities and Law, HKU SPACE, Suites A & B, 12/F United Centre, 95 Queensway, Hong Kong.

Notes to Non-local Applicants

To study in Hong Kong, all non-local applicants are required to obtain a student visa issued by the Immigration Department of the HKSAR Government, EXCEPT for those admitted to Hong Kong as dependants, or on a Permit for Proceeding to Hong Kong or Macao (also known as "One-way Permit"), or under any of the schemes indicated in paragraph (I) below, who do not need prior approval before taking up full-time and part-time studies. Non-local applicants who are issued with a valid employment visa or training visa, or members of the Consular Corps, or foreign domestic helpers, or admitted under any of schemes listed in paragraph (II) below, also do not need prior approval to pursue part-time studies. It is the responsibility of individual applicants to make appropriate visa arrangements. Admission to an HKU SPACE academic programme/course does not guarantee the issue of a student visa. Applicants may wish to note that part-time courses are not considered by the Immigration Department for student visa purposes except for self-financed, part-time locally accredited taught postgraduate programmes awarded within the HKU system through HKU SPACE.
